The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Twin Harbors on Lake Livingston Property Owners Association was held at 2PM Saturday April 12, 1986 at the home of Leonard Kinsey.

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Austin. All Directors were present except Helen Witherspoon. Visitors in attendance at beginning of meeting were Frank Shirley, Anna Kinsey, Kathy Brenner and Phylis Austin.

Minutes of the previous regular meeting were read by Secretary Brown. Motion was made by Marx, seconded by Kinsey to correct minutes to show that \$500 is not already owed to Attorneys (don't owe him anything). Motion carried. Motion was then made by Kinsey, seconded by Anderjeski to approve the minutes as read, with the change, and motion carried.

Minutes of the "Special" meeting held on March 22, 1986 were read and Motion was made by Marx, seconded by Derr that the minutes be accepted as read and the motion carried.

Financial report was presented by Anna Kinsey. Copy is attached. Motion was made by Marx, seconded by Brown to accept the report as presented and motion carried.

Various bills were presented for payment approval, involuding a bill for an additional 1.29 Tons of cold mix asphabt at cost of \$90.30. This is \$90.30 of \$440.30. The balance had already been approved for payment, being for 4 Tons. Motion was made by Marx, seconded by Anderjeski to pay all bills except pay only \$350. on Bill Waters invoice for cold mix asphalt and negotiate with him on the balance of his bill. Motion passed.

Old Business: In the matter of collecting maintenance fees on repossessed lots and lots owned in name of dummy corporations, upon suggestion of Jim Austin, a motion was made by Brown, seconded by Kinsey that we contact our lawyer, after we get information from Twin Harbors on Lake Livingston (Nat'l Land) as to which lots have been repossessed, and find out from lawyer exactly where we stand, legally, on possibly collecting maintenance fees on such repossessed lots. Motion carried.

New Business: Leonard Kinsey pointed out we have several visitors who want to talk about the "second boat ramp". Russell Chapman, living on Harbor Drive, indicated that he and neighbors of his have heard rumors that we might be going to dispose of the second boat ramp. He pointed out that he and several others living close to this remp do still use it. Another visitor who also uses the ramp questioned why this ramp is not maintained as is the main ramp. Jim Austin commented that two years ago a contractor wanted \$650. to repair the second ramp and that while some subdivisions have no ramp at all and none, to his knowledge have two ramps, we will absolutely not get rid of second ramp and, when we have funds available, we will see about making some improvement in second ramp. It was good to have these property owners at this Board meeting and they were invited to come back anytime, and to perhaps participate in some of our committee work.

As to "how to collect the new additional amount of maintenance fees", a motion was made by Brown, seconded by Kinsey that we wait until next board meeting and see what Jim Anderson may propose as to how to handle this collection. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Road Committee: Marx mentioned Brush Hog needs repair. It was pointed out that no motion approval needed because such expense is "normal" maintenance.

Insurance Committee: Jim Austin reported that Bill Powell had had his contractor come up with value for Recreation area buildings, it being \$24,600 on main building and \$2,700 on pump house building. He indicated that he and Kinsey went to the current insurance agent and insurance policy is being endorsed to change amounts of coverage on buildings and also endorse current liability policy so it will give correct liability coverage for the Swimming pool, recreation area, boat ramps and roads. The savings resulting from correcting property coverages should about offset additional charges due for correcting the liability coverages.

Pool Committee: Anna Kinsey reported that the pool has been resurfaced and three automatic chlorinators have been installed. Motion was made by Brown, seconded by Kinsey to contract for payment to Kathy Brenner for the pool season in amount of \$100 per week (\$2,200 for season) for labor to maintain pool, keep bathrooms and recreation area clean and mow recreation area. Motion carried. Motion was made by Kinsey, seconded by Marx to approve \$1,300 for pool chemicals for the season, to be bought in approximately two-month supplies at a time. Motion carried. Motion was made by Brown, seconded by Anderjeski to approve payment of approximately \$100 for additional fencing so new recreation area gate will properly fit. Motion carried. Motion was made by Kinsey, seconded by Brown to postpone action on an additional pump until next meeting (pump will cost about \$318.50). Motion carried. Motion was made by Anderjeski, seconded by Marx to approve expenditure of \$1,800 for new decking under pavilion roof and etch and resurface floor and patch pool deck so will look as good as new, and to be guaranteed indefinitely. Motion carried. Motion was made by Brown, seconded by Anderjeski to postpone any action on buying a Polaris Pool Sweep (\$850.00) until next meeting. Motion carried. Several of the visitors present wanted to be able to pay deposit and sign for "more than one key to the recreation area". After much discussion, a motion wax made by Brown, seconded by Kinsey to amend the Recreation Area & Pool regulations to issue up to two keys to a property owner on an"if-available" basis. Motion carried. Then, in connection with keys, a Motion was made by Marx, seconded by Kinsey that after the first fifty keys are disbursed, we order an additional fifty keys so supply will not run out. Motion carried.

Sewer Committee: Frank Shirley reported that $l\frac{1}{2}$ hours had been spent with a Mr. Bush and Mr. Bill Jones (who have been involved in Stowaway Bay addtion) and they say we need a Utility Attorney and Bush will try and find one for us. Shirley feels that the whole area—not just Twin Harbors—needs to group together in the effort to get a central sewer system extended to us and other additions near us. Shirley will report further when he hears further from Bush.

Architectural Committee: It was pointed out that two letters have been sent out on violations.

One of the visitors present suggested that a bulletin board be put up at the Recreation area keeping members posted of various developments and perhaps regularly posting copy of most recent minutes of a board meeting.

There being no further business to come before the board, a <u>Motion</u> was made by Marx, seconded by Heckler that the meeting adjourned at 4:30PM.
